II. Brief Historical Survey

- 1095: At the request of the Byzantine Emperor, Pope Urban II preaches the First Crusade at the Council of Clermont.
- 1096: Beginning of the First Crusade.
- 1099: Capture of Jerusalem by the Crusaders.
- 1119-1120: Foundation of the Order of the Temple in Jerusalem by Hughes de Payns.
- 1129: Drafted by Bernard of Clairvaux, the Rule of the Order is adopted at the Council of Troyes.
- 1139: The Order of the Temple is directly under the authority of the Pope, without going through civil and religious authorities.
- 1146: Beginning of the Second Crusade.
- 1187: Defeat at Hattin; Templars are beheaded. Saladin and the Muslim army retake Jerusalem.
- 1191: The port of Saint John of Acre becomes the administrative seat of the Knights Templar.
- 1202-1204: The city of Constantinople is sacked by the Crusaders.
- 1291: Saint John of Acre, the last bastion of the Latin states of the East, falls into the hands of the Muslims. The Knights Templar settle in Cyprus.
- 1293: Jacques de Molay becomes Grand Master of the Temple.
- 1307: On Friday, October 13, the Knights Templar are arrested in France by the men of King Philip IV the Fair. Accused of heresy and horrible crimes, they are viciously tortured.
- 1308: Under pressure from the Pope, King Edward II arrests the Knights Templar in England.
- 1310: 54 Knights Templar are burnt at the stake in France to force the other Templars to confess.
- 1312: The Order of the Temple is abolished. Its assets are turned over to the Hospitallers.
- 1314: Jacques de Molay and Geoffroy de Charney retract their confessions and are declared relapsed; they are burnt at the stake in Paris. Pope Clement V and Philip the Fair die in the same year.
- 1319: King Denis of Portugal founds the Order of Christ to welcome the surviving Knights Templar.









