Day One

Documenting Your Family History

Ancestor or Pedigree Chart

- Numbering: Men are always even; Women are always odd
 - o 1st person on chart #1 is always #1
- Names
 - o Surnames are in CAPS
 - Use Maiden Names
 - o "Nicknames" in quotes
 - o No surname use a?
- Dates DAY/MONTH/YEAR 8 JUN 1867
- Places
 - o Town, County, State, County
 - o Hanover, Columbiana, Ohio, USA

Family Group Sheet – one sheet per family unit (see attachment)

- Provides names, dates (birth, marriage, death)
- Place children in birth order
- Add pictures if you have them

Organizing Your Family History Findings

The Old-Fashioned Way

- Files
 - o One surname, couple per file
 - Each child gets their own file
 - o Contains copy of research notes, family group sheet, documents
 - o Each file is numbered, based on pedigree chart
 - o Research log for that family in the file
 - o Consider color coding folders
- Binders
 - Dividers
 - o Contains everything that would have been in the File Folder
 - o Photographs archival sheets for storage
 - o Consider how they are labeled

Technology Organization

- Save in the cloud or your computer or both
- Need to have standard back-up process
- Determine file names for elements
- Scanning
- Hard copies are still needed

Organizing Your Office

- Finding things in 10 minutes
- Keep it Simple
- Writing as you go, before filing, updating research Log

- Categories for everything genealogy
- Report broken links
- If you find a website not on hers report it
- Pay attention to other similar categories worth searching
- Start broad and then drill down
- Revisit as you gain more information on your family

FindAGrave https://www.findagrave.com

- Can search by name, memorial or cemetery
- Be cautious of information offered need to double check through other research
- Start broad and narrow
- Request photos and have patience
- Consider being a volunteer in your area

Google https://www.google.com

- Use Quotations around the name you want
- Use Quotations around the Name add plus sign for year
- Consider adding words like state name, genealogy, cemetery, wills or marriage records
